

One pill each day can prevent HIV acquisition!

What is PrEP?




PrEP stands for Pre-exposure Prophylaxis. It is a pill that can be taken once a day to prevent human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) acquisition, similar to how birth control can prevent pregnancy.

PrEP prevents HIV acquisition by stopping any HIV that manages to enter the body from making copies of itself. It does not prevent any sexually transmitted infections (STIs) other than HIV.



Currently, the medication approved for PrEP is emtricitabine (200mg), and tenofovir disoproxil fumarate (300mg), or the brand name, Truvada.




Studies have found PrEP to between 84-92% effective when taken every day

Why PrEP? Anyone can benefit from PrEP



PrEP can be an option for anyone's safer sex toolkit, including people who are at increased systemic risk for HIV acquisition. This includes people who:

Prefer barebacking (condomless anal sex)


Use injection drugs and/or use drugs during sex

Prefer condomless vaginal/front hole sex



where one or more people are HIV negative and one or more people are HIV positive

Are in a relationship



How to get PrEP in London, Ontario



No specialist is needed. You must be HIV negative to take PrEP; therefore, you will

need an HIV test before taking PrEP. You will also need to be tested for HIV once every three months while you are on PrEP. Here are some places where you can access PrEP in London:



PrEP might be covered by your workplace or university health insurance. Without insurance, the brand name, drug,

Coverage for PrEP



Truvada, can cost approximately 1000\$ per month; generic brands can cost between 250-500\$ per month. PrEP is available for coverage under the Ontario Drug Benefit (ODB) and the Trillium Drug Plan (TDP). People who access

the Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP), Ontario Works (OW), and seniors are eligible for coverage. PrEP is also covered for those with federal health insurance,

such as members of the armed forces, Indigenous people (with status) and some refugees.

As of January 2018, PrEP will be covered for people under the age of 25 in Ontario under the Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP+) program.
